Write a postcard to a friend describing what you can see.</p>	<p><i>"Would you prefer to live in the Lake District or London? Why?"</i></p> <p>Share your ideas and discuss this with an adult at home. Remember to compare the differences in buildings, population, and water sources. see if you both agree!</p>	<p>Create a drawing, collage, or small 3D model that shows what "home" means to you.</p> <p>Label your artwork with a few sentences explaining why having a safe, happy home is so important to people, even if they have to migrate to a new country.</p>	<p>Teach a family member the difference between a region and a county.</p>	<p>Take a walk around your local area with an adult. Look closely at your surroundings. Are you walking through an urban area or a rural area?</p> <p>Alternative Take a "virtual visit" to a coastal environment like Walton-on-the-Naze using a map or image search.</p>	<p>Investigate a journey made by someone in your family or community. Interview them to find out whether they have ever moved from another town, city or country.</p> <p>Find out:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Where they moved from? - Why they moved? - How they travelled? - What the two places were like. - What human and physical features they remember. 	<p>Watch a video or listen to the sounds of a coastal environment online (such as waves crashing or seagulls).</p> <p>How do these sounds make you feel at home?</p>
