

During this half term our topic will be 'What Makes Me, Me?' We will be looking at photographs of our family and talking about our similarities and differences, and where we come from. We will discuss what their likes and dislikes are, and exploring our senses through tasting different foods and going on listening walks. We will look at the different ways in which we move, observing changes in our bodies after we exercise, as well as identifying our body parts and ways in which to look after our bodies, such as healthy eating, and good hygiene.

#### Celebrating Achievements:

In the Early Years we focus on how the children learn and the skills they use, such as exploring and investigating, making their own choices, and making links in their learning. We will be celebrating these skills and choosing two children a week to award certificates to and they will look like the example below.



### **Why Not Try This at Home?!**

During this topic you might like to take a walk in the park and talk about the autumnal colours you can see, the different sounds you can hear, such as the crunchy leaves, and so on. You could get creative and make some paper plate faces and talk about your facial features. Some nice books linked to our 'Ourselves' topic that you might enjoy reading together include: 'The Colour Monster', 'All Are Welcome', and 'The Invisible String'. 
### **Top Tips for Talking:**

This half term's top tips:

- 1) Share books together – interactive books with flaps or different textures are really great.
- 2) Give your child time – they might need more time than you think to answer questions or follow instructions, so give them an extra few seconds to do this.
- 3) Younger children might find it difficult to tell you about their day at school. To support them, try giving choices like "did you paint a picture or play on the swings?" or ask "tell me one good thing that happened today". You could say one good thing about your day too, just to get the conversation going.
