

Phonics & Chromebook Meeting 29th September 2022



Hazelbury Primary School



- ✓ Children have daily phonics sessions.
- ✓ This involves the discrete teaching of phonics to support reading
- ✓ Children are taught to read by breaking down words into separate sounds or 'phonemes'
- ✓ They are then taught how to blend these sounds together to read the whole word
- ✓ There are around 40 different sounds

Phonics Terminology

 Phoneme is the smallest unit of sound in a word e.g. c-u-p c-a-t d-o-g

 Grapheme is a letter or a number of letters that represents a sound (phoneme) in a word e.g. <u>ai</u> <u>igh</u>

 Segmenting consists of breaking words down into phonemes (sounds) to spell.

Blending consists of building words from phonemes to read.

Both skills are important.

Phonics Terminology

• Digraph is when two letters make one sound e.g. oa in boat.

 Trigraph is when three letters make one sound e.g. <u>igh</u> in l<u>igh</u>t

 Split digraph is when two letters are not adjacent e.g. a_e in cake.



Monster Phonics is a highly-engaging, structured, synthetic phonics programme. It accelerates learning by allowing children to learn new graphemes by using monsters to group graphemes for recall and to provide an easy and fun memory cue for children.


My Phase 2 Sound Mat


















































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My Phase 3 Sound Mat

I have a child in reception and in year one. My child in year 1 is having some difficulties learning to read fluently. He can recognise individual sounds but he finds its tricky to recognise these in a word. Monster Phonics makes it really easy for him to recognise the sounds and he can easily read far more complicated words than usual. We had noticed his confidence was being affected by the fact he could see other kids reading more fluently. Monster Phonics books have really started to change that for him. He feels confident and pleased he can read the book through. The colour coding just clicks for him in a way that other systems hadn't before.

Both kids ask to use the app and love the common word power points. This has helped them change from being reluctant readers to being excited to try.




Phonics - Continuous Provision

How can you help?

- ✓ Encourage your child to use their sounds when looking at any type of text – books, posters, signs, etc
- ✓ Listen to the Phonics Pronunciation Guide to ensure that the letters are sounded in a 'pure' way

- ✓ Read with your child every day and encourage them to:
- Sound out, re-read to check it makes sense, and use pictures for clues.
- Ask questions about the book

Chromebooks




- Chromebooks are a digital device that all children at Hazelbury have access to as a way of promoting learning in and out of school.
